Centered-Set, Part 3 – Encounters with Jesus

This week we return to the theme of Centered-Set Church for a few weeks. For those who may be tiring of the subject, this time around the sermons will be story-based. So far, we have learned what becoming a centered-set church means for Salford. What or who is the center? How is "centered set" different from church as we have known it?

One thing we haven't asked yet is, "What does being centered on Jesus mean for me *personally*?" In the coming weeks, you will be asked to imagine yourself among of the disciples of Jesus. You'll watch Jesus draw all kinds of people to himself, and you'll be asked to consider, "What would it look like if our church began seeking people to join us in this way?

We'll be watching Jesus through the eyes of John the gospel writer. In the first week we'll listen in as Jesus encounters a skeptical student with some tough questions. Listen to his questions; bring one of your own.

Salford/Advent Garden Update, April 4, 2024:

Greetings fellow gardeners I hope you like rain. We got a real soaking this week. I can only pray the last weeks in April are dryer then the first weeks. Last Saturday a small crew topped off most of our raised box beds with a combination of mushroom soil and homemade compost. We wheeled about 50 wheelbarrow loads into the garden. We also planted 3 beds of red onion plants. These were planted in the beds at the very lower end of the garden and covered with netting. I call these my experimental beds. Where I try out new plants and ways to plant then. We may be putting more boxes in the upper end next year. I wanted to see how we can plant onions in raised bed boxes. This week I am taking Saturday morning off and going fishing. I am on Vacation next week so I will be finishing up prepping the upper end for Saturday the 13th and our first big planting day for 2024. WOOHOO here we go! Thank you to everyone who helps out with this mission. We are slowly gearing up for the spring and summer growing season. We will be praying for nice weather and a heavy harvest this year. Their mission seeks to energize the American faith community and actively seek to end gun violence through public witness and policy advocacy.

Did You Know? Celebrating Salford Mennonite Child Care Center's Upcoming 40th Anniversary

"Let the children come and walk beside the elderly, gaining wisdom from them, and giving back curiosity and energy."

A second child care campus was opened in December 1999 at the Dock Woods Community (DWC) campus of Living Branches. Its program was designed to encourage intergenerational interaction for the benefit of the children and the community residents.

Linda Martin was instrumental in planning a place where children were cared for across a hall from the memory care unit. Annie Musselman, a member of the congregation, was called to be the first director of this center. At that time, she was

involved in Early Education and very familiar with the child care center at the church.

Often children were invited to share activities with residents and greeted warmly when passing in the hall. The children's music classes were always a highlight for the residents passing in the hallway, many times stopping to sing with their little friends. The playgrounds were integrated into the residents' gardens & surrounded by apartments' & dining room windows. Harold Alderfer, a Salford member, often enjoyed many sunny days sitting under the pergola watching the children ride bikes and scooters on the path around the garden or playing in the sandbox.

It was a sad day when in March 2019 the center closed. However, many relationships were formed between children, teachers, parents & the residents of DWC from the creation of this unique child care center and



The Beginning of the Story - Understanding the Old Testament in the Story of Scripture By: Timothy J. Geddert




Although the Bible contains sixty-six books that usually span over a thousand printed pages, most Christians turn first--and sometimes only--to the New Testament. So often, Christian readers have little idea what to do with the Old Testament, if we read it at all. Sure, we value a few well-known stories and use a few psalms for personal devotions and for worship. Beyond that, many Christians find the Old Testament mostly confusing, troubling, or irrelevant.

But to understand the Bible as the grand story that it is--the story of God's dealings with humanity and relationship to the whole universe--we must learn to read the first three-quarters of Scripture as Jesus did, and as the New Testament teaches us to do. Walking through the arc and major themes of the Old Testament narrative, author and biblical scholar Timothy J. Geddert guides curious

readers of the Word into a fruitful and fulfilling reading of the Bible's first thirty-nine books, restoring joy in reading and studying the most important story ever told. DONATED

Planet Earth, God made a blue and green sphere, And designed it to orbit the sun once a year.


God made daytime and nighttime, climates and seasons, And all kinds of weather that vary by region.
