

Covid Safety Guidelines for Salford Peace Camp: June 27-July 1, 2021

Upon arrival each day all participants (campers and volunteer youth & adults) must verify the following:

- No positive COVID test in the past 10 days or contact with anyone with a + test in the past 14 days
- No COVID symptoms for the past 10 days (fever, shaking, chills, sore throat, difficulty breathing, unexplained muscle aches, new cough, loss of smell or taste), unless the person has tested negative for COVID since onset.

Our expectation is that volunteers who can be vaccinated against COVID-19 will do so.

Masks and Distancing:

- Masks are optional when outdoors, unless campers are not spaced at least 3 feet apart. Anyone who wishes to wear a mask will be supported in doing so.
- During a snack/drinking water, persons/households will be spaced 6 feet apart
- Campers should bring their own beach towel to sit on each day
- Efforts will be made to keep campers at least 3 feet apart, though it may occasionally happen that campers will be closer together
- To use the restroom, campers will go inside wearing their mask, and stay at least three feet apart
- We plan to have 15 minutes of singing to close each evening of peace camp and campers will be masked and spaced apart

Food and Drink:

- Please bring your own water bottle. Refill opportunities will be available.
- When snacks are provided, hand sanitizer will be provided before and after snack time.

Inclement Weather

In case of inclement weather, we may meet indoors in the classrooms upstairs. If so, families will be notified ahead of time, and campers will wear masks and be kept at least three feet apart in their cohort and six feet apart from other cohorts.
