A Service of Grief and Hope for Palestine

On Sunday, March 17, Salford will join with four other Mosaic Conference congregations - Ambler, Plains, Perkasie, and Methacton, for a service of prayer, lament, and hope for the people of Palestine and Israel.

On the 17th, there will be no worship service at Salford. Instead, we will meet at 10:15 a.m. at Plains MC 50 W Orvilla Rd, Hatfield, PA 19440.

The service will consist of singing, a children's time with storytelling from Gaza, and a service divided into prayers of lament and prayers of hope. Palestinians and Jews will talk about their griefs and hope for Palestine and give the congregation a chance to lay hands on them and pray for them. There will be a special offering collected that morning for the work of Mennonite Action. Mark your special offering envelope for "Mennonite Action". Please bring your regular Salford offering to Salford next week, or mail or drop if off at the church office when you are able.

There will be a nursery and children's activities offered during worship, as well as action/letter writing opportunities organized by Tori Jones Long.

This service will be a wonderful opportunity to deepen relationships with members of other Mosaic Conference churches and to stand in solidarity with suffering people in Gaza.

There are 100 Parking spots at Plains. We encourage as many as can to plan to carpool over to Plains on Sunday. Meet in the Salford parking lot to leave by 9:40 am to carpool.

Would you consider bringing a dozen cookies/donut holes/finger desserts to share for the after-service coffee time? (There will not be a meal as mentioned earlier) Thank you!

Finance Update for Salford Mennonite Church

For 2024, we will present a monthly update of our financial situation.

- We will need an average of \$16,200 in weekly offering from January through November and an average of \$31,000 in weekly offering in December to cover our budgeted expenses. Later in the year we can adjust our income need if expense budget savings or overages are recognized.
- Average weekly offering needed for January through November: \$16,200
- Average weekly offering received so far for January through November (8 weeks): \$14,320

Last week, Beth Yoder met with the Review Committee working under the Mosaic Conference Ministerial Committee. It has been 15 months since Mosaic Conference placed Beth's pastoral credential on probation. Mike Derstine, from Beth's pastors' support group, and I accompanied her to the meeting. She responded to a series of questions which the committee had given her in advance. She responded clearly and passionately to each question, and the committee appeared quite moved by what she said.

The Review Committee will now make a recommendation on whether to restore Beth's credential to active status and send that recommendation to the Ministerial Committee. Getting a list of jobs together that need to be done before we plant. The biggest job I already started. That was to weed the upper rows where we plant our potatoes and onions. A thick matting of weeds grew there, and it has to be removed so the soil can dry out and I can roto-till. The raised beds need weeding. Then they will need some more soil/compost added to the top. Some beds are in need of small repairs. There are a variety of small things that need to happen. I will be at the garden this Saturday if anyone has the desire

to get a little dirt under their fingernails. I can explain the schedule then. Wear your boots. I will be in and out of the garden each week until we plant our spring plants on April 13. The season is here, and it is time to gear up the garden.

Some additional funds were received this past week for the garden. I believe our total has topped \$13,000. I have run out of adjectives to describe how amazed I am. WOW! Blessings to all who thought so highly of this mission that they donated the amount we have now. Money does not come easy. 
Church Library Spotlight

Over five hundred years ago, the Western church underwent a period of massive recalibration that exposed abuses and theological blind spots and revived the historical foundations of Christianity. Today, signs suggest that we have entered another
