Contents (NEW items only)

- 4 spiral or perforated-pages notebooks (8.5 in x 10.5 in and 70 sheets)
- 8 new unsharpened pencils
- 1 ruler (flat, good quality; must indicate 30 cm; inch markings optional)
- 12 colored pencils (in packaging)
- 1 large eraser
- 2 new black or blue ballpoint pens
- 1 small (metal only) pencil sharpener (one or two holes). If you have trouble finding metal sharpeners, leave them out and MCC will provide them.

August 24, 2023 Salford/Advent Garden Update:

Greetings fellow gardeners, the garden continues on it journey through the growing season. The string beans we planted the other week are up and growing great. We have to keep after the weeds or they will take over, what else is new! The pole beans are climbing the trellis they are about 5 feet high and rising... This week we will start to harvest our winter butternut and honey nut squash. We planted a smaller version of the bigger squash. These will only be about 2-3 lbs. each, kind of a personal size squash. Zucchini, both yellow and green, are still hanging in there. Our summer planting of string beans had one last blast but they will be done after this week. Lima beans continue to be plentiful; I haven't checked the numbers but we could be on record pace with these this year. Green bell peppers continue their surprising year. I was not expecting a big harvest from our peppers but they just keep flowering and peppers appear out of nowhere. The Native American corn we planted has EARS! WOO HOO! They are not the biggest but I am thrilled with what I see. This corn will be dried and shelled. The string beans we planted in the Three Sisters garden are flowering and we should see beans develop soon. These will be used as dry beans also. The squash in the Three Sisters garden is really going to town both crooked neck and the patty pan look good so far. Tomatoes are on their last hurrah. This week was the last big harvest for the season, only a few more will be picked from here on until frost. Tomatoes just do not do well in that end of the garden. Monday we will be sending a batch of tomatoes, peppers and onions up to Bauman's Apple butter, in Sassamansville for our annual Salsa run. The tomatoes did not do as well as last year but I have enough for 1 batch of Salsa.

Thank you to everyone who helps out week in and week out through the entire season. The volunteers who give their valuable time to make this garden a success are a really special group. Their dedication and hard work are really appreciated. Steve, 215-872-6616, rsblank@verizon.net


