Celebrating the Garden

One of my favorite Sundays at Salford is the annual fundraiser-luncheon for the Advent-Salford Garden. Last Sunday was another great event!

I’m not sure which part of Garden Sunday is my favorite. The food is wonderful, of course. I came into the building soon after 6 a.m. Donna Barndt was already in the kitchen preparing the pork for roasting. By the time worship was ending four hours later, the whole building smelled of pork and sauerkraut.

After second hour, the fellowship hall filled with folks from Salford, Advent, and an array of community ministries that receive produce from the garden. It’s moving to hear the speakers-some of them workers who provide groceries and meals, and others who are the recipients of the meals.

Each year “farmer” Steve Blank performs his greatest gift of love – bravely overcoming his fear of public speaking to thank volunteers and report on just how much food was raised during the summer. Close your eyes and try to picture thousands of pounds of vegetables.

This year, Steve was hoping to raise \$9,000.00 from the luncheon and other donations to put toward a storage shed and other supplies. By mid-week we had received \$11,600.00 toward the goal. A Service of Grief and Hope for Palestine

On Sunday, March 17, Salford will join with four other Mosaic Conference Churches - Ambler Mennonite, Plains, Perkasio, and Methacton - for a service of prayer, lament, and hope for the people of Palestine and Israel. For months we have watched, cried, prayed and sought to raise our voices for a cease-fire in Gaza. Now we will gather to join our voices as one.

On the 17th, there will be no worship service at Salford. Instead, we will meet at 10:15 a.m. at Plains Mennonite. Following the service there will be a fellowship meal.

This service originated from conversations between Pastor Jacob Curtis at Ambler, and Sam Kuttab, a Palestinian Mennonite who lives in Wyncote and relates to Oxford Circle Mennonite Church in Philadelphia. The tentative plan is for singing, a children’s time with storytelling from Gaza, and a service divided into prayers of lament and prayers of hope. Palestinians and Jews will talk about their griefs and hope for Palestine and give the congregation a chance to lay hands on them and pray for them. There will be a special offering taken for the work of Mennonite Action, the grassroots organization that has arisen as a response to the violence in Gaza.

This service will be a wonderful opportunity to deepen relationships with members of four other Mosaic Conference churches and to stand in solidarity with suffering people in Gaza. More information to come next week about the fellowship meal and offering.

Welcoming Path Learning Corner

Many people refrain from talking about sexual orientation and gender identity or expression because it feels taboo, or because they're afraid of saying the wrong thing. This weekly primer on terminology is to help give us the words and meanings to help make conversations easier and more comfortable. This week, we review a few additional terms related to sexual orientation and gender identity.

Transitioning: A series of processes that some transgender people may undergo in order to live more fully as their true gender. This typically includes social transition, such as changing name and pronouns, medical transition, which may include hormone therapy or gender affirming surgeries, and legal transition, which may include changing legal name and sex on government identity documents. Transgender people may choose to undergo some, all or none of these processes.

Questioning: A term used to describe people who are in the process of exploring their sexual orientation or gender identity.

Outing: Exposing someone's lesbian, gay, bisexual transgender or gender non-binary identity to others without their permission. Outing someone can have serious repercussions on employment, economic stability, personal safety or religious or family situations.

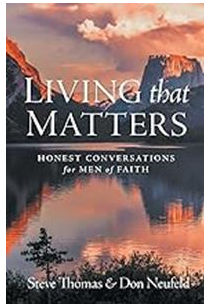

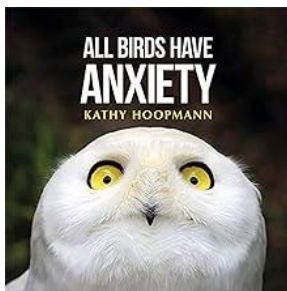
Living that Matters – Honest Conversations for Men of Faith By: Steve Thomas & Don Neufeld
